# PROGRAM NOTES

## Parent/Guardian Responsibilities

By enrolling your child in an After-School Enrichment class, you are responsible for the following:

- Knowing class start and end dates!
- Ensuring your child is picked up on time.

## Registration

- Please register your student(s) online at <https://www.friendsofhawthorne.org/enrichment> during Registration Week (March 18th-22nd).
- Classes that fill during registration week will be determined by lottery among those who register by March 22nd at 11:59pm.
- **Note: Because classes are handled by lottery, classes may appear full, even if they are not. Please 'Enter Lottery' to register for a class. You will get an email confirmation from 6crickets that you have successfully entered the lottery.**
- We will notify you of class assignments on Saturday, March 23rd. Please do not send your child to class without written confirmation of enrollment. Any classes not filled during the lottery will be available on a first-come, first-served basis starting on March 24th.
- Payment is due by midnight on Friday, March 29 to finalize enrollment. If your payment is not received by then, your student's spot will be released and made available to other students. *Note: payments will be processed at a later date (April 14).*
- After the lottery process, unclaimed lottery class spots will be available on a first-come, first-served basis starting Saturday, March 30th at 9 am.

## School Closure/Class Cancellation

Afternoon classes will be canceled if SPS announces an early school closure or late start due to weather or other reasons. There are no refunds when a single session of a class is canceled because the District has altered the schedule. Prorated refunds will be considered starting with the second instance of a District class cancellation during the session. A class meeting canceled by the instructor may result in a pro-rated refund. If a class does not enroll sufficiently, it may be canceled. You will be notified and your fees refunded. **There are no classes on Monday, May 27, for Memorial Day.**

## Withdrawal From Class

If you withdraw from a class, you will receive a refund based on the following schedule:

- Before the first day of class: full refund minus \$25 administrative fee.
- After the first class but before the second class: 90% refund minus \$25 administrative fee.
- After the second class: no refund. NOTE: Classes taught by outside vendors (i.e., the Provider in 6crickets is not listed as Friends of Hawthorne PTA) may have different cancellation policies.

## Getting To and From Class

Students are picked up from and returned to the gym for After-School Enrichment classes. Parents are responsible for collecting their children promptly from afternoon classes. There will be no supervision for children after their class ends. If prompt pickup becomes an issue, your student may be removed from the class without refund. **No bus transportation will be offered for After-School Enrichment classes.**

## Behavior at Hawthorne

We have the expectation of respect for teachers/instructors and good behavior during classes.

Students are expected to maintain the same behavioral standards that they have during the formal school day. If an instructor identifies a behavior issue, the following steps will be taken:

- At the first incident, the instructor will call parents/guardians regarding student behavior.
- The student will be given one trial class to improve.
- If the disruptive behavior continues, we reserve the right to remove the student from the class without refund. Please discuss enrollment with your child to be sure they want to attend.

## Clothing

Please send your children with clothing appropriate for their class. Athletics classes require loose-fitting clothes and closed-toe rubber-soled shoes.

## General Information

After-School Enrichment classes do not generate a profit for the Friends of Hawthorne (FOH). A fee of \$15 for FOH and \$10 for 6crickets.org are included in the listed class fees to cover the costs of managing the program.

### SCHOLARSHIPS ARE AVAILABLE

FOH intends for all students to be able to participate in the After-School Enrichment program regardless of financial need. **Students who are eligible for the Free and Reduced Lunch program may enroll in one class at a 50% discount. Any other students with financial need may enroll in one class at a 25% discount.** To use the discount, enter the discount code at checkout: 2024SPR50 for 50% and 2024SPR25 for 25%. *Only one reduced-fee class per student per session.*
