PROGRAM NOTES

Parent/Guardian Responsibilities

By enrolling your child in an After-School Enrichment class, you are responsible for the following:

- Knowing class start and end dates!
- Ensuring your child is picked up on time.

Registration

- Please register your student(s) online at <u>https://www.friendsofhawthorne.org/enrichment</u> during Registration Week (January 1st-5th).
- Classes that fill during registration week will be determined by lottery among those who register by January 5th at 11:59pm.
- Note: Because classes are handled by lottery, classes may appear full, even if they are not. Please 'Enter Lottery' to register for a class. You will get an email confirmation from 6crickets that you have successfully entered the lottery.Each student may enter the lottery for up to three classes.
- We will notify you of class assignments by January 8th. Please do not send your child to class without written confirmation of enrollment.
- Payment is due by midnight on January 11th to finalize enrollment. *Note: payments will be processed at a later date (January 20).*
- After the lottery process, any remaining class spots will be available on a first-come, first-served basis starting Friday, January 12th, at 7pm.

School Closure/Class Cancellation

Afternoon classes will be canceled if SPS announces an early school closure or late start due to weather or other reasons. There are no refunds when a single session of a class is canceled because the District has altered the schedule. Prorated refunds will be considered starting with the second instance of a class cancellation by the District during the quarter. A class meeting canceled by the instructor may result in a pro-rated refund.

If a class does not enroll sufficiently, it may be canceled. You will be notified and your fees refunded.

Withdrawal from class

If you withdraw from a class, you will receive a refund based on the following schedule:

- Before the first day of class: full refund minus \$25 administrative fee.
- After the first class but before the second class: 90% refund minus \$25 administrative fee.
- After the second class: no refund. NOTE: Classes taught by outside vendors (i.e., the Provider in 6crickets is not listed as Friends of Hawthorne PTA) may have different cancellation policies.

Getting to and from class

Students are picked up from and returned to the gym for their After-School Enrichment classes. Parents are responsible for collecting their children promptly from afternoon classes. There will be no supervision for children after their class ends. If prompt pickup becomes an issue, your student may be removed from the class without refund. **No bus transportation will be offered for After-School Enrichment classes.**

Behavior at Hawthorne

We have the expectation of respect for teachers/ instructors and good behavior during classes. Students are expected to maintain the same behavioral standards that they have during the formal school day. If an instructor identifies a behavior issue, the following steps will be taken:

- At the first incident, the instructor will call parents/guardians regarding student behavior.
- The student will be given one trial class to improve.
- If the disruptive behavior continues, we reserve the right to remove the student from the class without refund. Please discuss enrollment with your child to be sure they want to attend.

Clothing

Please send your children with clothing appropriate for their class. Athletics classes require loose-fitting clothes and closed-toe rubber-soled shoes.

General Information

After-School Enrichment Programs do not generate a profit for the Friends of Hawthorne (FOH). A fee of \$15 for FOH and \$10 for 6crickets.org are included in the listed class fees to cover the costs of managing the program.

SCHOLARSHIPS ARE AVAILABLE

FOH intends for all students to be able to participate in the After-School Enrichment Program regardless of need. **Students who are eligible for the Free and Reduced Lunch program may enroll in one class per session at a 25% discount.** To use the discount, enter the class-specific discount code at checkout, using 2024WIN25. *Only one reduced-fee class per qualifying student per session.*

CREATING POP-UPS & PAPER CONSTRUCTIONS

Students will explore how to create pop-up constructions out of paper. They will learn many techniques to create artwork that leaps off the page. There will be an emphasis on how to construct the pop-up pieces and at the same time students will learn how to add hand drawn elements to their projects. In the second part of the session, students will develop their visual storytelling skills as they illustrate a short story with their own pop-up constructions.

JOYFUL PRINTMAKING: PLAYING WITH PATTERN AND PAINT

Color, pattern, and paint! This winter, we'll dive into the wonderful art of printmaking. Artists from around the world will inspire our making sessions: we'll use our imaginations to travel to the Lascaux caves in France, where prehistoric peoples printed their handprints on the walls of caves; around the world, and into modern times with the Ndebele of South Africa, Matisse, and Ruth Asawa from California. Our art will be inspired by the rich patterns we find in these artists' work. Explore a variety of printmaking methods: printing with foraged materials, creating spontaneous mono-print paintings and printing with unusual materials. Your student will come home with a variety of handmade frame-able artworks, and a collaboratively printed t-shirt or apron.Our skills will culminate in a final class collaboration project. Our group will focus on cultivating creativity with a growth mindset, play and collaboration, and joy in making art together!

Our Little Coders class offers young children the perfect opportunity to develop their computational thinking skills, create their first programs, and have a blast with their friends! Our curriculum is tailored specifically for early readers and takes into consideration their cognitive abilities and attention span, typically found in children aged 5-7.

We utilize age-appropriate online tools, including Lightbot, Kodable, and Scratch, to introduce fundamental coding skills. Beginner students learn essential coding concepts such as Loops and Conditions. Through practice, they apply these concepts to build simple projects, including games, stories, and even animated characters. Returning and experienced students encounter new challenges that will allow them to push their coding knowledge to the next level. **Note: Students will use their school-issued ipad in this class and bring their device to and from each class.**
